Award **1 mark** for a suitable possessive pronoun correctly inserted, eg:

- ➤ mine
- > yours
- ➤ <u>hers</u>
- ➤ ours
- ➤ <u>his</u>
- ➤ theirs

Do not accept:

- ➤ misspellings and/or punctuation errors, eg:
 - <u>myn</u> (mine)
 - **yores** (yours)
 - her's (hers)
 - theres (theirs)

Diagnostic commentary	
Correct	22%
Common error 1	pronoun which is not a possessive pronoun inserted
	Twenty-five per cent of pupils made this error.
	A number of pupils inserted a pronoun (eg: <i>he, she, it</i>) instead of a possessive pronoun. Most inserted <i>it</i> . This suggests an opportunity to review the different types of pronouns with pupils and examine how possessive pronouns function.
Common error 2	word which is not a pronoun inserted
	Seventeen per cent of pupils made this error.
	A number of pupils did not appear to be familiar with the term <i>possessive pronoun</i> or the term <i>pronoun</i> . Instead they inserted words of other classes which completed a grammatically correct sentence – for example, <i>Amy's</i> . The national curriculum requires that pupils should be introduced to the term <i>possessive pronoun</i> in year 4.
Common error 3	appropriate possessive pronoun spelt incorrectly
	Two per cent of pupils made this error.
	This error was made by a small number of pupils but highlights the important point that, in questions like this, pupils are required to spell words correctly in order to gain the mark.
